## **Survey Information**

The Survey was concluded in June 2020.



**878** Engineering Professionals fully completed the survey.



**44** Is the average Age of Survey respondents.



**98.5% Male** 1.5% Female



The average time taken to complete the survey was 6 minutes.

This survey report details Salaries for Engineering Professionals working across the UK Food & Beverage Industry. It provides Salary breakdowns by Job Titles, Geographical Location and covers the following Sectors:

- Food & Beverage Manufacturing
- Food Grade Packaging
- Food Storage & Distribution
- Machinery Suppliers (Capital Equipment)
- Engineering Services Providers
- Industrial Refrigeration / Refrigeration Services

The survey was conducted during a period that the UK's Food & Drink Industry faced unparalleled challenges, Covid has been massively distributing the industry for over six months, and trading relationships with the EU are still unclear.

The survey briefly reviews salaries across 20 Engineering job positions within the UK Food & Drink industry and breaks down average salaries by Sectors and Geographical Regions. The survey then probes deeper to provide further information into the following positions:

- Maintenance Engineers
- Engineering Management
- Design Engineers
- · Field Service Engineer
- Project Engineer & Project Management
- Sales Engineers / Sales Managers (Equipment)

This year we have introduced "Field Service Manager" as separate job title.

Previously, Facilities/Site Services Engineers held the position of lowest paid Salary category. However, having benefitted from one of the highest pay increases over the past 12 months averaging 8.4%, Facilities/Site Services Engineers are no longer the lowest-paid Salary category.

2020 Salaries for London based Engineers in the Food & Drink Industry increased by an average of 6.5% over a 12 month period.

Although still the lowest paying region, significant pay increases were reported in the North East with a 6.9% year-on-year Salary increase.

6% of survey respondents were Chartered Engineers.

The average basic salary for Chartered Engineers who completed the survey is £53,830 pa. This is a reduction of £5,467 against the 2019 survey, but still 22% higher than those without Chartered status.

Those holding Higher Degree qualifications are paid 25%

more than those holding HNC/HND qualifications.

19% of Engineers who responded are Degree qualified. On average, these individuals receive basic salaries £7,628

Engineering Professionals working for a Food Machinery Supplier or Engineering Services Supplier are twice as likely to be Degree Educated, compared to those working for a Food & Beverage Manufacturer.



£40,240 is the average basic Salary for Maintenance Engineers working across the UK Food & Drink Industry in 2020. This figure represents a 2.9% increase over the past 12 months.

Maintenance Engineers have also benefitted from a 4.3% increase in P60 Earnings during 2020.

Salaries for Maintenance Engineers within Food Grade Packaging, Milling and Seafood remain below average. The Meat sector appears to have addressed lower than average Maintenance Engineer salaries with a 5.7% increase compared to 2019.

Perhaps surprisingly with Degree level qualifications increasing across the board with Engineers aged under 40, a gradual decline in Degree qualified Maintenance Engineers is reported, from 11% in 2017, down to 7% in 2020.

Degree educated Maintenance Engineers earn £1,136 more than their non-Degree qualified peers. Maintenance Engineers with an Electrical bias earn £1,776 more than Mechanically Biased Engineers.

Despite demand for Electrically biased Maintenance Engineers outstripping supply and being far greater than demand for Mechanically biased Maintenance Engineers, survey results demonstrate no increase in Electrically biased Maintenance Engineers joining the Food & Drink sector, which would indicate that the sector is not doing enough to attract Electrically biased Maintenance Engineers.

On average, Maintenance Engineers work 3.9 hours per week above their contracted hours. 84% of Maintenance Engineers working in the Food & Beverage Industry are paid for overtime with £441 being the average monthly overtime payment.

Maintenance Engineers who do not receive overtime payments, seem to be compensated with a slight increase to their average basic salary, which is £1,567 higher. They also work an average of 2.5hrs less each week.

Overall, Basic Salaries and P60 earnings in 2020 for those at Engineering Management level has barely increased compared to our 2019 survey and those at Group Engineering Manager and Engineering Director level actually saw a drop in average Salaries.

22% of survey respondents at the Engineering Management level were Degree Educated. On average, basic salaries for these individuals were £14,233 higher than those without a Degree.

**8.4%** of Engineering Management respondents were Chartered Engineers and on average, they enjoyed base Salaries **31%** higher than those who didn't hold Chartered status.







Contract Design Engineers earn average Salaries £24,073 higher than Permanent employees (*P60 Earnings*). This divergence in Salary for effectively the same job demonstrates why 'Contracting' remains a popular option for Design Engineers. However, a consequence of this is the ongoing difficulty Food Machinery businesses experience when attempting to appoint Design Engineers on a Permanent basis.



Only **15%** of Project Professionals are paid for overtime. **65%** of Project Professionals benefit from annual Bonuses.

**30%** of Project Professionals working for a Food Machinery Business or Engineering Services Provider are "Home-Based". This figure has increased by 12% since our 2019 Salary Survey.

**23%** of Project Engineering Respondents worked directly for a Food & Drink Manufacturer. £51,796 is the average basic salary for all Project category respondents, which is less than a 1% increase from our 2019 survey.

Degree Qualified Project Professionals earn an average of £2,814 per year more than individuals who do not hold a Degree.

**36%** of Project category respondents hold some form of Project Management Qualifications with Prince2 and APM being the leading Project Management qualifications held by survey respondents.

**12%** of Project category respondents were Chartered Engineers and earn **£10,160** more than non-Chartered Project Professionals

#### **Additional Benefits Received:**



44% of the Private Healthcare Schemes are Part Funded with the employee required to make a financial contribution or top-up.

18% of Engineering Professionals who completed the survey stated they benefit from Flexible Working Hours offered by their employer. This figure will increase significantly in the next survey as Work From Home becomes normalised (post COVID-19).

13% of respondents take advantage of the Governments Childcare Voucher Scheme.

The Meat Sector remains one of the lowest employer pension contributors at just over 5% contribution.

The average value of Car allowance schemes to the employee is £6,284 per year / £523 per month.

#### **Pension Rates**

95% of survey respondents are enrolled in some form pension with their employer. 6% is the average rate for **Employer Pension Contributions** made by the UK Food & Drink Industry across all Engineering Personnel. This increases to 7.3% for Senior Engineering Management / Director level.




## **JOB SATISFACTION & CAREER MOTIVATIONS**

60% of survey respondents expect their pay to increase over the next 12 months.


**60%** of respondents said they do not received sufficient training opportunities.

**52%** said they do not have regular performance reviews.

72% of respondents felt their role lacked a defined career path. This figure is still a lot higher than we would hope for, but we have seen a gradual reduction over the past 3 years of surveys. Our 2018 survey shown that 81% of individuals lacked a defined career path.

## 2020 Engineering Salary Report - Food & Beverage Industry

## **Covid Pandemic**

It is too early to fully grasp the ramifications and effects of the 2020 Covid Pandemic, however, so far in 2020, the Food & Drink Industry is demonstrating great resilience and only 16% of survey respondents indicate being negatively affected.


Early analysis of survey findings show that the vast majority of Engineers / Engineering professionals either made redundant or furloughed are employed by Food Machinery businesses or Engineering Service providers to the Food & Drink Industry.

Our 2020 annual survey indicates that the Food & Drink Manufacturing sector is performing robustly and furloughing much fewer workers proportionally in comparison with many other sectors of UK industry.

Indeed, in some areas of the Food & Drink Manufacturing sector and Food Supply Chain, there has been a shortage of workers brought about by the pandemic and self-isolating, resulting in anecdotal evidence of wage inflation.

It will be interesting to fully report and review the impact of COVID-19 in our 2021 Salary Survey.
